

## **Title of Abstract**

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### **1. Introduction (*Heading*)**

**Please review this document: paper in MS Word file must be written in compliance with these instructions.** Therefore, it is suggested that authors use this file to construct their papers.

The abstracts will be included in the Book of abstracts. In the abstract, the authors should state concisely the clue assumptions, thesis, results and the conclusions of the full paper. The abstract should **not be longer than 2 pages**, prepared according to presented settings of margin, font, etc. If it is only possible please construct the abstract according to following sections: introduction, materials and methods, results, conclusion, references.

### **2. Paper format, style and fonts (*Heading*)**

This document defines margins, line spacing and type styles for each section (examples of the type styles are provided throughout this document and are identified in italic type within round brackets). Note that the style for each section can be found in the “Style” menu of MS Word.

#### **2.1. Paper format (*Subheading*)**

Please use this template with A4 format in MS word, and do not change margins. They are set in such a way that enables printing the abstracts in B5 format: top margin - 5,00 cm; bottom margin - 4,90 cm; left margin - 4,00 cm; right margin - 4,00 cm; header - 2,00 cm; foot - 1,20 cm.

Files should be saved in MS Word \*.doc or \*.docx format and sent on Conference e-mail address: **bsd@tu.kielce.pl** until **31<sup>st</sup> of August 2024**. Please do not forget to enclose all figures in additional files (prepared according to guidelines in section 3).

#### **2.2. Style and fonts (*Subheading*)**

Publication text should use 11-point Times New Roman font with 1,00 leading (*Normal*). All text should be justified and all paragraphs should begin with 5mm tabulation.

Please do not change the header and do not enter page numbers.

### 3. Tables, figures and equations (*Heading*)

All figures and tables should be numbered and centred. The figure captions should be included below the figures; table heads should appear above the tables. All figures and tables should be cited in the main text as Fig.1, Table 1, etc. Tables and figures should be placed near the main text if cited for the first time.

Table titles should be written using 9pt Times New Roman font. The table title (without bolding) should be followed by the full word **Table no.** (see Table 1). There should be no spaced line between the table title and the table. An empty line (9pt) should be left after the table.

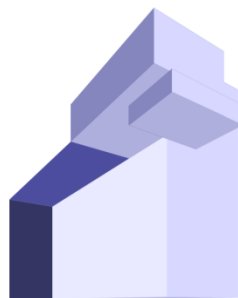
**Table 1.** The caption for the table should be included over the table.

This text should be no smaller than 10 pt.

The figures titles should be written with 9pt Times New Roman font (without bolding) and should be followed by the abbreviation **Fig.no.** There should be no spaced line between the figure and the title of the figure. An empty line (9pt) should be left after the figure (see Fig.1). Figures should be submitted for review in separately with resolution no smaller than 300 dpi in \*.tiff or \*.jpg files.

It is recommended not to include any text in the figures and tables which is smaller than 10-point Times New Roman font.

The used equations should be clear, mentioned in the text. All symbols used in the equations must be explained in the text. They should be centre aligned and numbered consecutively on the outer right margin as is shown below (note that the equation is centred using a centre tab stop). Two empty lines (9pt) should be left before and after the equation.

$$(a_1x + b_1)(a_2x + b_2) = a_1a_2x^2 + (a_1b_2 + a_2b_1)x + b_1b_2 \quad (1)$$

#### 4. References (*References*)

Paper should contain up to 4 key references. References must be numbered in order of appearance in the text and listed individually at the end of the manuscript. References should be numbered in order of appearance and indicated in square brackets-e.g., [1] or [2, 3] or [2-4]. References should be written using 9pt Times New Roman font.

The reference section at the end of the paper should be edited based on the following examples:
